
Experiences with the Student-Run Clinic Rotterdam

- Embedded in internal medicine clerkship
- Early exposure to actual prescribing
- Monthly interdisciplinary consultation incl pharmacy
- "Triple win" (student, patient, supervisor)

International Student-Run Clinic project

- International
 - national differences in guidelines, drugs available, insurance, prescription limits
- Online
 - on paper
 - more interprofessional
 - discussions in break-out rooms
- Not bound to a clinic
 - more educational (Student-Run Medication Review)
- Voluntary
- In English
- Under ERASMUS+ Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics Teach
 the Teacher program (CP4T); seven meetings from 10/2022–05/2024





International Student-Run Clinic project

- Scientific evaluation
- Questionnaires to students and teachers from 3 sessions
- Participants:
 - 27 Students (response rate 40.0%)
 - 70% medicine, 19.2% pharmacy
 - First timers 70.8%, >1 time: 29.2%
 - 10 Teachers (response rate 55.6%)
